TRAVELLERS TALES: Private and Sporting Flying Display at Old Warden, Sunday 27th June 1971. by C.Barber.

Old Warden, for those who are not acquainted with the smell of castor oil and the feel of fabric covered aircraft, is the home of the only flying museum in Europe, The Shuttleworth Collection.

Here on the last Sunday of every month visitors are treated to a 2 to 3 hour show of early aircraft. To many the memories of flying such machines as the Avro 504 and the Avro Tutor soon make the trek south worth while. To spectators too young to know about such things, just to see such machinery fly is like visiting Hastings to see the Battle of Hastings being fought.

This particular show though is slightly different in that privately owned vintage aircraft are invited to attend and show there paces rather than the trusts own aircraft.

Spectators were certainly not disappointed as by 1 p.m. what must have been the largest collection of different vintage aircraft ever seen in the U.K. were to be viewed.

The appearance from out of the hangar of Archaeopteryx G-ABXL and the Comet Racer G-ACSS also had the photographers busy.

The only incident of the afternoon was to Chilton D.W.1a G-AFSV which tipped onto its nose whilst taxiing in cut grass. Happily neither aircraft nor pilot were hurt.

I enjoyed the show tremendously this year, as I did last year, and can only say if you have never been to a Shuttleworth Trust show, then you don't know what you are missing, but be warned, go with plenty of spare film and a copy of "Veteran and Vintage Aircraft", you will need it.

Once again we have a number of movements on the ILS, first an unidentified Hastings on 7/6 then Hastings TG503/553 on 22/6 using call signs HGF 22 and 46 respectively. Cessna F172 'WGK' was on the ILS on 20/6 as was Falco 'VUJ' which later landed. CSE Twin Comanche 'TZV' on 1/7 ends the ILS section. The most interesting visitor this month depends on your personal preference, for me it was the ex Botswana Airways Dove A2-ZFM which is now owned by Brellair MEC. It arrived from Sherburn on 12/6 for customs clearance for Jersey en route to the wine rally at Angers in France. The return flight clearing customs inbound on 14/6 and after a short stop at LBA it returned to Sherburn. A2-ZFM is the former G-AMXY which was given a C of A renewal by Yorkshire Light Aircraft after arriving at LBA on 18/10. It departed on 14/12/68 on its way to Air Charters Zambia at Lusaka ( /68 where it arrived on 11/1/69 and was re-registered 9J-AAE. Botswana took delivery on 28/8/70. Of the remaining visitors ones of note are the Canadian Twin Comanche B CF-XYZ and CF-YVQ one of the new straight tailed Bonanza E33A models c/n CE282, both were entrants in the England/Canada air race and both came to YLA for attention to the radios. The Bonanza arrived 24/6 and left 28/6 it bore the name "Banana Express". Cessna 337B F1-AVF on 24/6 is another African import and is c/n 337B-0575 previously 5H-MNI in Tanzania. The German invasion on 29/6 was part of this years Irish Sea Rally and the aircraft were from Calais to Turnhouse, the most interesting was probably the Bolkow 207 D-EOXX the first visit of a rare type. Cessna T210K N9461M on 29/6 is with the Brussels agency and has c/n 59361. On the military side Basset XS772 on 25/6 was reportedly carrying the Iranian Minister of Defence on a mission to do with purchasing tanks. The Varsity WF328 on 3/7 was positioned into LBA from its base at Towlcliffe prior to its appearance there in a display later the same day. The aircraft was coded "B" and used callsign CV073. The various visits of Cherokee Six 'WGY' are to do with parachute drops at fêtes and other functions. Islander 'XXH' on 3/7 was F/T Sherburn for fuel and was also doing paradrops. Due to unserviceability of Avro 748 'RAY' on three occasions we were graced with replacements 'TMJ' on 16/6 and 'TMI' on 21/6 and 24/6.
